ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER REPORT

- School Trustee Administration has put in a request to the School Trustee to attend an upcoming Regular Council
 meeting, as per Council's request.
- ATCO Electric No information has been presented to Administration since the last Regular Council meeting.
- Natural Gas Distribution System Utility Source Inc. is waiting for a response from ALTAGas with respect to the (a) Net Book Value amount and (b) updated for Accumulated Depreciation the Two Hills distribution system effective Dec 31, 2017. AltaGas seems reluctant to give it. Administration has contacted them again requesting the same information.
- 2018 Insurance :
 - There have been two claims opened up due to the recent water breaks on 50 Avenue.
 - Insurance premiums have dropped just over 5% over last year; representing over \$7,300.00.
- 2018 Live Assessment Attached comparison of assessment from 2017 to 2018. Assessment growth is \$343,690 for Residential and +\$188,990 for Non-Residential.
- Arena Roof A change order was required as there were rotting boards. Administration approved the change order so that construction could continue without delay. Cost of the change order to replace the bottom 16" of rotten boards is \$2,473.05. Pictures of the rotten boards are attached.
- Strategic/Sustainability Planning Administration has not had time yet to investigate consultants and prepare a draft RFQ.

Elected Officials Remuneration Expense

During the 2018 Budget deliberations it was noted that the policies out to be reflected in the Budget.

In order to justify the estimated costs for elected officials in the budget the 2011-05 Elected Officials Remuneration Expense policy should be amended.

Also, the Income Tax Act has changed, effective January 1, 2018, that elected officials' remuneration is no longer partially exempt

Also, effective January 1, 2018, the Income Tax Act changed to reflect no exemptions for elected officials on their total allowances and honoraria.

NEW BUSINESS

Sanding Agreement and Release of Liability

Public Works used to have a mutual agreement with Carillion regarding sand for sanding the roads. Unfortunately, Carillion and Alberta Transportation have put an end to the mutual agreement and the Town's Public Works has had to now purchase sand from the County of Two Hills. The cost per y3 is \$40.00.

It takes approximately 1y3 to sand most parking lots with exception of large industrial lots or the hospital.

The Town has a Sanding Agreement and Release of Liability with a few landowners effective January 1 – December 31, 2018. The cost for service is \$30.00 if completed at the same time as the Town's regular sanding maintenance or \$45 upon special request. This does not cover the cost of the sand.

Labour rates, per labourer, during regular work hours is \$40.00/hour (2007-04 Public Works Rates for Equipment, Services, Rental and Materials Policy).
